

Lesson Plan – Discovery English Grade 3

Unit 6: The Riddle in the Forest

Theme: Honesty, Wisdom, Making Good Choices

Text Type: Play Script

Duration: 2–3 Periods

Period 1 – Reading & Understanding the Play

Learning Objectives

Students will:

- Identify characters and setting.
- Understand the structure of a play.
- Explain the main message of the story.

A. Reading Ready – Answers

1. The story is about a girl in a forest solving a riddle and finding treasure.
2. It is a play/script.
3. The audience is children.

B. Guided Reading

Students read aloud by taking roles:

- Narrator
- Lina
- Owl
- Fox

Focus on:

- Expression
- Tone
- Dialogue format

C. Story Reflection – Answers

1. Lina first meets the Owl.
2. The Owl challenges her with a riddle in rhyme.
3. She refuses to lie and chooses the truthful path.
4. She discovers the treasure is a glowing book called “Truth.”
5. Main points:
 - Lina finds a scroll and map.
 - The Owl gives her a riddle.
 - The Fox tempts her to lie.
 - Lina chooses honesty.

- She gains wisdom instead of gold.

Period 2 – Grammar & Language Skills

Grammar Galaxy – Contractions

Matching Answers:

didn't → did not

I'm → I am

we'll → we will

can't → cannot

she's → she is

Students write sentences:

- I'm ready for the adventure.
- She's brave and wise.
- I can't lie.

Prepositions

Sorting:

- Place: near, under
- Direction: out of, up
- Possession: of

Example sentences:

- The owl sat on the tree.
- Lina walked into the forest.

Types of Sentences

1. Look behind the tree. → Command
2. That riddle was tricky! → Exclamation
3. What is your answer? → Question
4. Lina solved the riddle. → Statement

Students create one of each type.

Period 3 – Phonics & Writing

Consonant Blends

ha_nd → hand
ju_mp → jump
ba_nk → bank
te_nt → tent

Rhyming Words – Answers

1. moon
2. ground

Mood Match

Forest → Mysterious

Treasure Room → Exciting

Owl's Tree → Calm

Tone Builder

Words showing Lina's feelings:

- carefully
- bravely

Example sentence:

Lina bravely answered the clever riddle.

Creative Writing Task

Write a Riddle

Example:

I shine at night and glow so bright,

You see me in the sky each night.

What am I?

Moon

Students create their own 4-line riddle.

Assessment

Formative:

- Role-play reading

- Grammar exercises
- Rhyming activity

Summative:

- Short comprehension quiz
- Write a riddle
- Identify sentence types
